

Artistic Section

Unless otherwise specified, the Show Secretary should be notified of entries two weeks before the Show. Entries after this date may be accepted at the discretion of the Show Secretary, and subject to space constraints.

Items may only be entered once in the Artistic Section at any given AGS Show (i.e. items which have been exhibited at that show in previous years are not eligible).

Members may stage their own exhibits at the same time as plant staging, or send them by post. Postal entries must be sent at least one week before the Show and **sufficient postage for the return of the exhibit should be included**. Exhibits which cannot be collected at the end of the show will be returned to the sender as soon as possible. The Society cannot be responsible for breakage, damage or loss.

All paintings and drawings must be original – not photocopies.

Paintings and drawings will be judged on strict adherence to the schedule and thereafter by artistic quality.

Paintings, drawings and needlework must not exceed 40cm x 30cm including mount. No glass or framing please.

The name and address of the exhibitor should appear on the reverse of each entry, and the name of the plant(s) on the front

The Society may reproduce in the Alpine Gardener any art work, subject to clearance of any existing copyright.

An Alpine Plant is defined in Rule 14, page 11; details of Merit Medals, page 5; points system, page 10.

NOTE A. Classes 228, 229 and 275 are intended for art which is not in a traditional botanical style, possibly in a much looser, impressionistic or graphic style
